DUNCOMBE CEMETERY INFORMATION GUIDE



Originally managed by the Ferryhill & Chilton Joint Burial Board, Duncombe Cemetery was first opened in 1887 with Ferryhill Town Council taking over its management on 31st March 1988.

Since 2000 Ferryhill Town Council has secured in excess of £150,000 in grants to completely transform the Cemetery. Neighbours Lafarge-Tarmac Ltd. have been a major financial Investor contributing funds to regenerate Duncombe Cemetery to improve the preservation, conservation and restoration of the site for the respectful enjoyment of the public visiting it.

The Memorial Garden and Ashes Garden are both particular assets to the Cemetery which continue to receive praise by residents and visitors. The Heritage Centre and footpath link leading from the Cemetery to the Carrs Nature Reserve have also encouraged local residents and visitors alike to take a keen interest in the Cemetery and the facilities that it offers.

Ferryhill Town Council continually strive to improve Duncombe Cemetery and the facilities available on site and are proud to have maintained its prestigious Green Flag status since 2008.
